



The Fallacies of Atheism

The proponents of the new atheism have adopted a debating strategy of insisting upon material proof for the existence of God while refusing to accept a definition of the word God upon which people of faith through the ages would be able to agree. The author demonstrates that such a definition makes the existence of God a truism and therefore that atheism itself is fallacious, either by a false definition to advance an argument -- the straw man fallacy -- or by defying logic in asserting the negation of a truism. From other aspects of what should be considered the mislabeled new atheism, the author then suggests the more appropriate label of materialism. The author then shows the fallacies in materialism and the material court, the latter being the venue of the material proof demanded by the new atheists, so-called. That discussion then leads to a presentation of a simple metaphysical framework, in which can be conducted more constructive debates as to one aspect of the nature of God. This metaphysical framework is then applied to a falsely attributed social flaw presented by the new atheists, showing that flaw to be based on...



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
